<u>Young Carers</u>

Young carers are children and young people under the age of 18 who often take on the practical and/or emotional caring responsibilities that would normally be expected of an adult. Young Carers may have to prepare meals, look after money matters, give medicine, translate, arrange appointments or take care of a relative's hygiene. Also, caring for someone means giving them emotional support. It can be a lot for someone to handle, especially if they are having to come to school as well.

Mrs Willett is our Young Carers' Champion in school. She works closely with Centre 33, the organisation responsible for the Young Carers Project in Cambridgeshire. If you feel your child is taking on a young carer's role at home, please contact Mrs Willett as we are able to offer resources and support for your child.



We have had a number of reports of young children being left unattended in cars whilst parents drop off older children at school. I appreciate that this may not for any extended length of time, however it does place these children at potential risk and we kindly ask that you avoid doing this at school drop off and collections.

There also continues to be parking issues, with cars parked inappropriately where children cross the road near the church. We have had some near misses where it has been difficult for children (and parents) to cross the road safely due to restricted view.

Please allow plenty of time for collection. This will ensure you can find a safe place to park that does not compromise the safety of our children.



Please ensure correct PE kits are in school every day: plain or logo t-shirt in team colour, black or navy shorts or tracksuit bottoms, sweatshirt/zipper if needed (no hoodies and no named clothing or football kits) and trainers. These should be clearly named. Long hair should be tied back every day.

Jewellery should not be worn in school. A single pair of studs is allowed but these need to be removed for PE lessons. No smart watches are allowed. Normal watches are fine, however school cannot be held responsible if any damage occurs. These should not be worn on PE days. We please ask that no rings, necklaces or bracelets are worn.
