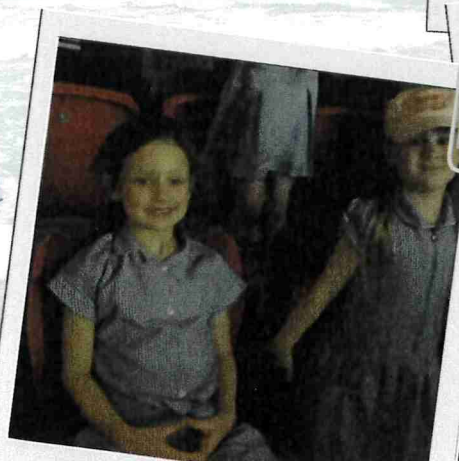
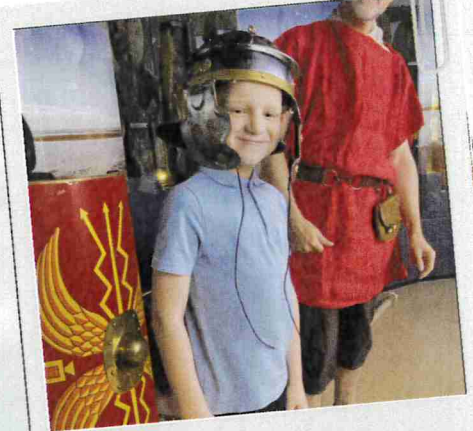
"Welcome to July, the month when summer dreams take flight and possibilities shine as bright as the sun!"

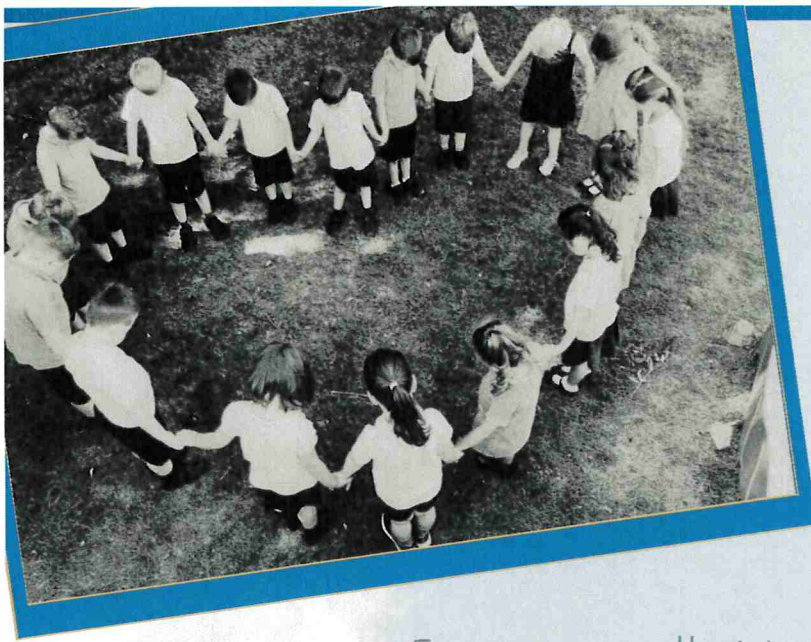
As the term draws to a close, we look back on the fantastic opportunities our children have experienced in July.

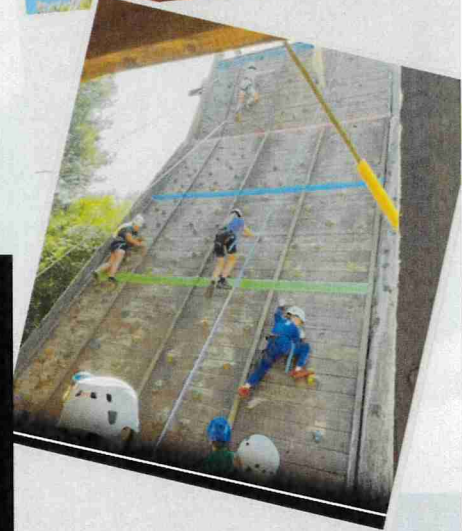
The next Big Sing is hopefully being planned before Christmas so keep an eye on singing club sign ups in the new school year!

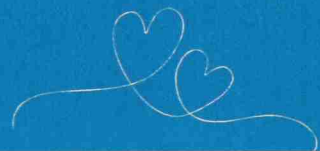

Letter from the LGB

Dear Parents and Carers,

I should like to update you with what your LGB has been doing.

Since my last report, I can confirm that all monitoring visits have taken place by the LGB.

Howard and I looked at the various methods of how assessment is carried out. This meeting was with Miss Gill and we went into classes as well.

Kimberley and myself talked to Mrs McMullen about how phonics was taught through Little Wandle. This led to three further visits where we looked at how reading was taught and developed and showed the application of the phonics being learned.

Nicola Willett, who is our SEND Governor, has had a meeting with the school SENDCo to discuss the progress of these children.

Howard is our new Safeguarding Governor and he has had a meeting with Mrs Willett to check that all procedures are being followed.

Emma has been in school to talk to Mrs Willett about attendance and she attended a School Council meeting with Miss Gill and the class representatives.

This term, Rebekah has been into school to talk to Miss Gill about improving outcomes in writing.

Following on from Kimberley's initial report about Forest Schools, she is going to write an end of year report that shows what progress has been made.

After a visit, we all write a report of our findings and the content is then discussed within the formal LGB meetings.

Some of us attended the Easter service in the Church and Kimberley, Emma, Howard and myself all went into school during SATs week to help with adult cover and to monitor.

I am writing this before the SATs results are published but I know that when we observed the SATs, the children were to be praised for their mature attitude and one could see they were trying their very best. I am sure they will be pleased with their achievements. We are confident that the results will be good.

In addition, may we take this opportunity to congratulate all the children throughout the school for their hard work resulting in the progress made across all years. Well done to the children completing their phonics screening and times table tests.

We have had our three termly LGB meetings and this term we have an extra one in July to look at all the assessment results.

May I take this opportunity on behalf of the LGB to wish all pupils and staff who maybe leaving Leverington Academy every success in pastures new.

I hope everyone has a happy and safe summer holiday and fingers crossed that the sun will continue to shine!
