Appointments

We would like to politely remind all parents and carers that medical appointments should be made out of school hours. Where this is not possible, please provide the office with evidence of your child's appointment date, time and address to log with our attendance records.

We have noticed an increasing number of children being picked up from school early. We kindly remind families to avoid collecting children early on a regular basis. Frequent, early pick-ups can disrupt learning and cause children to miss important teaching time. We understand that occasional early pick-ups may not be avoidable, but keeping these to a minimum helps us to maintain a calm, consistent routine for the children. Any children leaving early for sporting activities must have a letter from the provider.



Being picked up from school ten minutes early, once a week, equates to losing an entire day of school.

Leaving school at 3 o'clock once a week equates to three days of missed learning.
