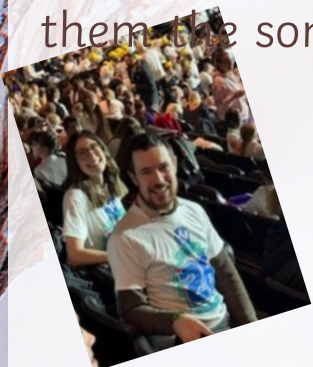
"January is for dreamers—the ones who believe anything is possible in the year ahead."

Wb 9th February: Make and buy gallery

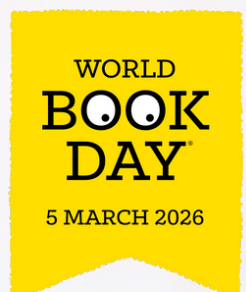

Tuesday 10th February - Safer Internet Day

Parents are then invited to a 2:00pm talk - on Thursday 12th February - in the school hall from an ICT specialist to learn more about supporting safe online habits at home.

Safer Internet Day

Safer Internet Day takes place on Tuesday 10th February, with celebrations and learning around the theme '**Smart Tech, Safe Choices - Exploring the safe use of AI**'.

We are exploring the impact of AI on all of our lives, looking at how AI can be used for good, and giving advice and guidance that empowers people to use AI safely and responsibly.

On Thursday 12th February at 2:00pm, we will be holding an event in the school hall for parents/carers.

This session, in partnership with Internet Matters, will provide parents/carers with an understanding of how they can best support their children when they are online. It will cover parental control options, effective online safety conversation topics and will signpost you to resources you can access for the future as your children grow up and the online landscape changes.

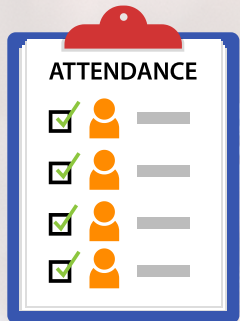
PE

Please ensure that children bring their full school PE kit into school every day. Timetables may change at short notice, and having their kit in school means they can take part in all activities safely and comfortably. PE is a statutory part of the national curriculum, and all children are expected to participate unless there is a valid medical reason.

A reminder that PE kit must be the official school PE uniform; hoodies, patterned t-shirts and football kits are not permitted.

Thank you for your support in helping every child take part fully and be prepared for learning.

Attendance



Strong attendance is vital to every child's learning, and we continue to encourage all pupils to be in school every day, aiming for our whole-school target of 96%. Mrs Willett monitors attendance closely and will contact parents, sometimes by letter or by inviting them to a meeting, if a child's attendance becomes a concern, so that support can be offered early. To help families stay informed, the office sends out weekly emails showing each child's current attendance, ensuring parents are always aware of their child's progress. School and home working together plays a key role in improving school attendance, so please reach out to Mrs Willett if needed.

School day timings:

Gate opens at 8:45am

Gate closes at 8:55am

Registers open at 8:45am and close at 9:15am.

If your child arrives after the gate has closed, but before 9:15am they will be marked as 'late'.

Children arriving after 9:15am will be marked as 'U' which is unauthorised.

Parents need to fill in the late book at the school office, explaining why their child is late.

School day finishes at 3:25pm. All children must be collected at 3:25pm from the playground unless otherwise agreed by a member of SLT.

Should you need to make alternative pick-up arrangements for your children, we ask that you please aim to let the school office know by 3pm who will be picking your children up at the end of the day.

Young Carers

Young carers are children who help look after someone at home or live with someone who has an illness, disability, mental health difficulty or substance-misuse issue. Many young carers don't realise their role, and families may be unsure whether to share this information, which means some children go without the support they need. In school, young carers may sometimes appear tired, worried or distracted, and they can find it harder to keep up with work or attend clubs.

Our school is committed to identifying and supporting young carers so they can thrive both academically and emotionally.

Once identified, ongoing support will be provided by our Young Carers champion. Attendance and attainment will be closely monitored and the data used to implement early support or intervention. A range of extra-curricular opportunities matched to their needs will also be provided.

If you think your child may have a caring role, or if you would like to talk to us confidentially, please speak to Mrs Willett, our Young Carers Champion. We're here to help every child feel understood and supported.

Communications with staff

Our school rules are Be Ready, Be Safe and Be Respectful. This applies to staff and parents, as well as the children.

At our school, we value open, respectful communication between families and staff. Whether speaking with us in person or contacting us by email, we ask that all conversations are conducted calmly and courteously so we can work together effectively. Every decision we make is guided by what we believe to be in the best interests of the children, both individually and as a community. We recognise that parents may sometimes have questions or concerns, and we welcome constructive dialogue. However, we rely on your support and trust rather than ongoing challenge, so that we can maintain a positive, collaborative environment where every child can thrive.

If you wish to speak to your child's class teacher with any questions or concerns, please contact the school office to arrange a time convenient for both yourself and the teacher.
