LEARNING SUMMARY



Spelling

Spelling this term will involve revision of the previously taught patterns and rules and ensuring a good understanding of statutory and tricky words.

Reading

We will be reading "Ways to be Me" by Libby Scott and Rebecca Westport as our class reader as well as a playscript version of William Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet.

Writing

We will use the story Romeo and Juliet by William Shakespeare as inspiration for writing newspaper reports and detailed short narratives.

Maths

For maths will we be learning how to efficiently convert different types of measure and revising previously taught content ahead of the SATS tests.

Science

Our science topic this term is "living things and their habitats" and we will be learning how to classify and group different animals and organisms, depending on where it is that they live.

History

Our History study for the summer term is entitled "Significant Monarchs" and will look at the impact that monarchs, such as Henry VII, had on England as a whole.

Geography

For Geography this term, we will be looking at different countries around the world and comparing their climates, population and other key features.

Religion & World Views

For our religious study this term, we will look at the question, "What place does Religion have in our world?"

Art

Our Art topics this term will utilise the skill of sculpture as well as perspective drawing.

Design Technology

Our DT projects for this term will look at developing key skills to create a steady hand game, and automata machine and a product concept for a portable navigation device.

Music

Our music topic for this term will be "Film Music." We will look at the different ways that music is used in film to convey mood and feelings within a piece.

PSHE

Our PSHE topics for this term will look at financial capability, and understanding and managing change to aid transition to secondary school. Further information about Sex and Relationships Education will be shared later in the term.

Computing

Children will explore and create objects in 3D design software. They will plan, design and create their own 3D design.

PE

PE will be Athletics with an initial focus on sports day practice. This will involve practising all of the races for sports day to allow children to select their 2 preferred race choices and be confident while competing in the mandatory races.
